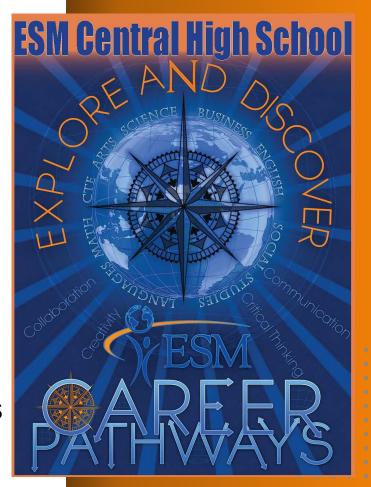

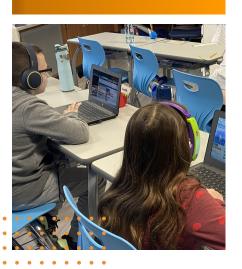

Budget Development Priorities

Federal Grant Funding Update



Coronavirus Response & Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA)

- ESM Allocation: \$3.1 million (until 9/20/23)
- ESM CRRSA Investments:
 - Outdoor learning space equipment
 - Various facility improvements (HVAC filters & improvements, UVC units, bottle fillers, school security system enhancements)
 - Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), hand sanitizer, wipes & disinfectant
 - Classroom furniture to promote social distancing.
 - Technology equipment, WiFi & cyber security enhancements

American Rescue Plan (ARP)

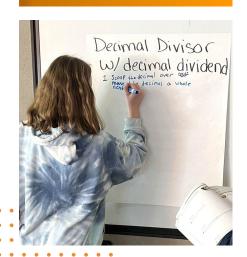
• ESM Allocation: \$4.9 million (through 9/30/24)

ESM ARP Grant Investments:

- Support for summer & after-school programs
- Instructional Coaches & Itinerant Learning Associates
- Consulting services (Good Life Foundation, NYU PINE Program, Solution Tree, CCSI / Promise Zone)
- Curriculum supplies, materials & professional development
- Additional Special Education related services staff & instructional resources
- Social Emotional Learning curriculum,
 monitoring tools & professional development



State Budget Update

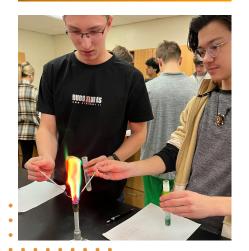


Overview

- April 1 budget deadline missed
- Final budget bills passed early May
 - Full funding of Foundation Aid
 - High-Impact Tutoring
 Set-Aside not included
 - Additional funding for meals in CEP eligible schools

Cost Containment & Revenue Efforts

- Cooperative & bulk purchasing -Approximate annual savings: \$2.4 million
- Participation in NYSMEC Approximate annual savings: \$9.7 million (electric),
 \$6.9 million (gas)
- Energy efficiencies and savings
- Revenue maximization FEMA, NY State and Municipalities (SAM), Onondaga
 County, Medicare RDS, Medicaid

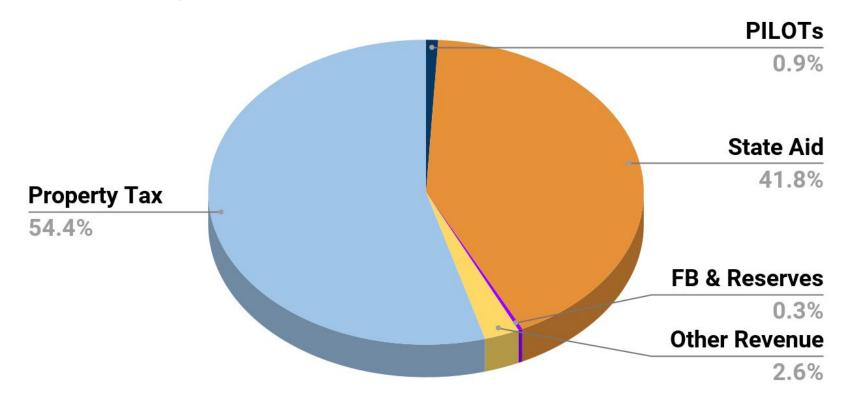

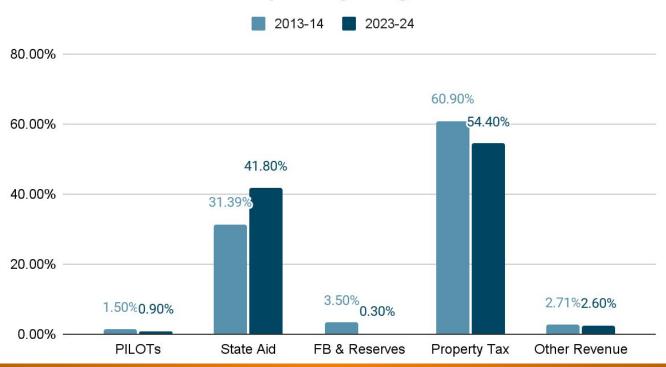
2023-24 Revenue Sources

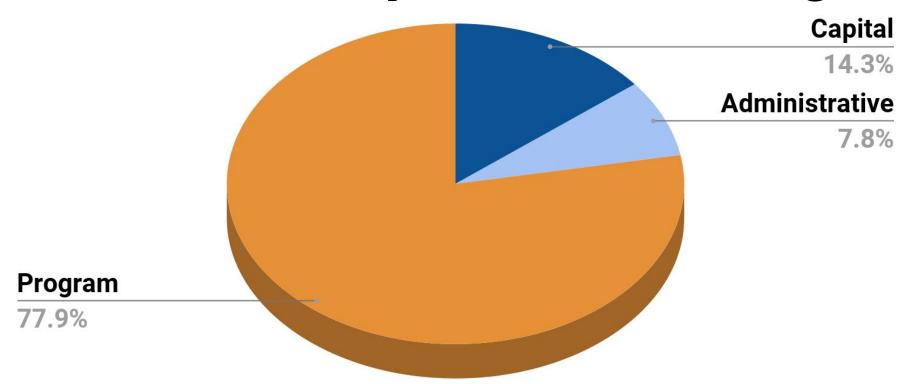

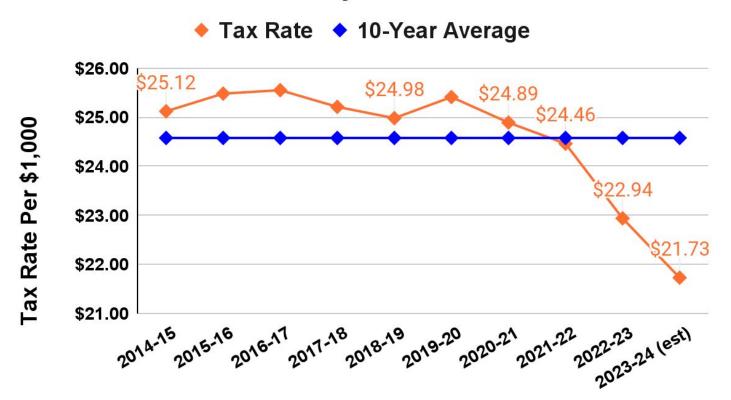
2023-24 Proposed Tax Rate

	Current 2022-23	Proposed 2023-24	\$ Annual Change
Tax rate per \$1,000 of assessed value	\$22.94	\$21.73	(\$1.21)

Estimated tax bill <u>decrease</u>: \$84.51 annually (based on a \$100,000 home with Basic STAR)

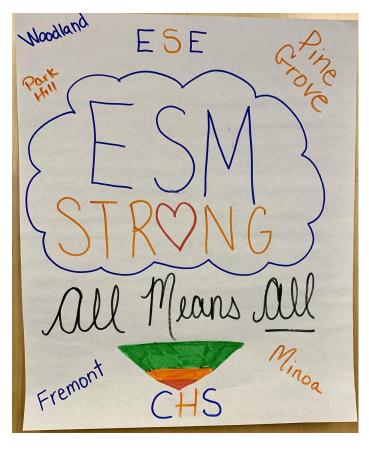
